I would also like to take this opportunity to extend my warmest congratulations to my brother, Mr Patrick Achi, for all the good work he is doing at the head of the Government and more particularly at the Regional Council, to promote the influence of this magnificent region.

My sincere congratulations also go to my dear sister, Florence Achi, for her leadership and for all the actions she carries out for the benefit of the people, especially the women of Adzopé.

Congratulations to Patrick and Florence, ... Let's give them a big round of applause!

My dear sisters of the Mé region,

You are in the limelight today. We celebrate you not only for the life you have given, but above all for all your efforts to ensure the well-being and education of your children. You make great sacrifices to give them the best possible future. You work hard to support your spouses and contribute to the balance of your families. And it's for this self-sacrifice and commitment to love that you deserve to be celebrated every year.

Dear Mothers of the Mé, I would like to solemnly thank you for all your efforts and your contribution to the construction of our beautiful country. On this day, I would like to pay you a vibrant tribute. Please give them a big round of applause!

I would also like to congratulate all my sisters who have been distinguished today, and whose merit has been recognized. You have my full support.

My dear sisters,

The celebration of Mother's Day in Adzopé also gives me the pleasant opportunity to strengthen your empowerment and promote the well-being of a greater number of families in the region.

Indeed, I have always trusted ivorian women's potential, and I have always believed in their strength, their courage and their capacity to be productive.

That's why I initiated the Support Fund for Women of Côte d'Ivoire in 2012, with the help of my dear husband, President Alassane Ouattara, to support the empowerment of my sisters.

Today, thanks to the President of the Republic, the FAFCI has reached a capital of 26 billion CFA francs, for over 71 billion CFA francs of activities financed thanks to an excellent national repayment rate of 98%.

This amount has enabled more than 360,000 women to carry out income-generating activities, lifting nearly 2 million people out of poverty.

I would like to take this opportunity to reiterate our sincere thanks to President Alassane Ouattara, women's first advocate, for the confidence and support he has shown in all the women of Côte d'Ivoire. Let's hear it for him!

My dear sisters,

For the Mé region, a capital of 2,075,530,000 CFA francs has already been made available to our sisters in the four departments, with an excellent repayment rate of 97.58%, for which I would like to congratulate you.

I have therefore decided to encourage you to continue along this path, by granting you additional funding of 500,000 million FCFA, which will bring the total amount of the FAFCI fund for the Mé region to 2,575,530,000 FCFA. I hope that this additional funding will enable many more of our sisters to start up income-generating activities.

I also wanted to show you my support and affection by bringing you food and non-food donations, worth a total of 500 million FCFA, which have just been listed. These include agricultural equipment, tricycles, sewing and hairdressing equipment, as well as a number of gifts for our trading sisters. I remain convinced that you will make good use of them.

I'm also offering you 5,000 Uniwax loincloths, which I know will give you great pleasure.

My dear sisters,

Before I close my speech I wish to express a desire that is dear to my heart, which is peace in our communities, towns and villages. Indeed, we know what is at stake in the forthcoming elections, which will arouse a great deal of enthusiasm on everyone's part.

And I would like to urge you, my sisters, to show moderation and talk about peace to all those close to you.

Be, at all times and in all places, agents of social cohesion and promoters of living together. I know I can count on each and every one of you to preserve what is most precious to us.

This is how we will continue to develop our beautiful country together, in fraternity, love and peace.
